**Student Council hosts annual 'Glow Run' with new**

"The STUCO Executive Board wanted to try something other than the Glow Run we have had. We decided to incorporate some kind of game into it because the theme of Homecoming was Game On," Annalise Alvarez said.

**1** // We ended up calling the event, "Let the Games Begin" and made it an obstacle course similar to Hunger Games." For the event, 240 T-shirts were ordered and distributed to students who completed the obstacle course.

The Hunger Games replica course included a tunnel made out of cardboard boxes, folding tables to dodge, jumping through hula hoops, crawling between chairs and string and running laps around the track.

Joe Stewart was in charge of providing resources and monitoring the creation of the course.

"I contacted several department and local stores to get cardboard boxes donated for the tunnel as well as other supplies needed. I got most of the obstacle course ideas from researching online and asking creative people for help," Stewart said.

In all, 210 students participated. Freshmen were the largest grade in attendance with 105 at the start of the race.


